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ManpowerGroup Employment Outlook Survey: employers in Poland report their most optimistic hiring intentions since 2010

Polish employers report optimistic hiring intentions for the coming quarter with +11% Net Employment Outlook in January-March frame time. This marks the 19th consecutive quarter of positive forecasts for Poland's labor market and the strongest optimism since 2010. The results are positive with employers in all 6 regions and 9 of the 10 industry sectors expecting to grow staffing levels by varying margins during the next three months. The strongest labor markets are in Wholesale & Retail Trade, Manufacturing and the Restaurants & Hotels.

Warsaw, Poland, 12 December 2017 – Polish employers report optimistic hiring intentions for Quarter 1 2018 according to the ManpowerGroup Employment Outlook Survey released today by ManpowerGroup in Poland. The seasonally adjusted Net Employment Outlook stands at +11% increasing by 2 percentage points quarter-over-quarter and remaining relatively stable year-over-year. Of the 750 Polish employers surveyed, 14 percent anticipate adding to their workforces in the coming quarter, 7 percent plan reductions and 77 percent expect no change.

"We finish this year with a very good situation at labor market and the first-quarter survey results indicate that the start of a new one will be even better," said Iwona Janas, Country Manager ManpowerGroup in Poland. "Forecasts for different sectors are mixed but in most of them we observed optimistic hiring plans. Heading into 2018, we can expect some reduction in seasonally related job offers, but that doesn't affect the overall picture of the labor market. The current situation can be called promising. The future situation looks encouraging and we expect that employer optimism will still grow stronger," adds Iwona Janas.

Staffing levels are expected to increase in nine of the 10 industry sectors during the next three months. The strongest labor market is forecast for the Wholesale & Retail Trade sector, where the Net Employment Outlook stands at +22% and Manufacturing sector where employers anticipate steady job gains with an Outlook of +19%. Respectable hiring plans are reflected in Outlooks of +14% in Restaurants & Hotels sector. Elsewhere, Mining & Quarrying sector employers expect cautiously optimistic Outlook with +11% while Construction reporting +10% and Public & Social sectors employers expect modest payroll growth with +9%. However, employers in the Agriculture, Hunting, Forestry & Fishing sector and Electricity, Gas & Water Supply sector forecast +4% and +2% Outlook respectively. The weakest Outlook of -2% is reported by Finance & Business Services.

When compared with the previous quarter, hiring intentions are stronger in five of the 10 industry sectors. Wholesale & Retail Trade sector employers report a considerable improvement of 11 percentage points, while the Outlook is 7 percentage points stronger in the Restaurants & Hotels sector. Employers in the Mining & Quarrying report slight increase of 4 percentage points in the

Public & Social sector 3 percentage points of increase. Meanwhile, Finance & Business Services sector employers report a decline of 5 percentage points and 4 percentage points decline in Construction sector. Elsewhere, employers report relatively stable hiring intentions or no change.

Hiring prospects strengthen in six of the 10 industry sectors when compared with this time one year ago. The most noteworthy increases of 15 percentage points is reported in Mining & Quarrying and 14 percentage points in the Wholesale & Retail Trade, while improvements of 9 and 5 percentage points are reported for the Electricity, Gas & Water Supply sector and Public & Social sector, respectively. However Outlooks weaken in three sectors – Construction (-13 percentage points), Agriculture, Hunting, Forestry & Fishing (-6 percentage points) and in the Transport Storage & Communication sector (-5 percentage points).

Employers in all six regions expect to grow staffing levels during the coming quarter. The strongest labor market is forecast by employers in the South, who report a Net Employment Outlook of +17%. South-West and North-West employers also anticipate steady payroll growth, reporting an Outlook of +10%, while the Outlook for the Central Poland stands at +9%. Elsewhere, Outlook of +8% is reported in the North and +7% in the East.

When compared with the previous quarter, Outlooks improve in two of the six regions – in the South (+9 percentage points) and North-West (+3 percentage points). Meanwhile, employers in the East and South-West report a decline of 2 percentage points and 1 percentage point in the North.

Year-over-year, Outlooks strengthen in three of the six regions, most notably by 17 percentage points in the South. Employers report a 5 percentage points increase in the North and Outlooks are 3 percentage points stronger in Central. However, hiring intentions are 9 percentage points weaker in the South-West, 3 percentage points weaker in the South and 1 percentage points in the North-West.

Employers in all four organization size categories expect to increase staffing levels during the coming quarter. The strongest hiring prospects are reported by Large employers with a Net Employment Outlook of +21%, while Outlooks stand at +11% in the Small, +9% in the Medium-size and at +3% in the Micro-size.

Global Forecast Mixed

ManpowerGroup's first-quarter research reveals that job gains are expected in 41 of 43 countries and territories during the January-March time frame. And for the second consecutive quarter since the global financial crisis in 2009, employers report no negative Outlooks among the 43 countries and territories. Additionally, employers in a number of countries, including Australia, Japan, Norway, Poland, Romania and the United States, report their strongest hiring plans in five years or more. First-quarter hiring confidence is strongest in Taiwan (+25%), Japan (+24%) and India (+22%), while employers in Italy, Austria (0% for both) and France (+2%) report the weakest hiring plans
